These are the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Town of Bass Lake, Sawyer County held on Tuesday April 17, 2018. Members Present: Chairman Justin Hall, Supervisors Doug Mrotek, Dave Aubart, Don Adams and Clerk Erica Warshawsky. Members Absent: Treasurer Kari Aderman.

24 Townspeople were present (21 electors).

Chairman Hall called annual meeting to order at 6:34 pm.

Clerk Warshawsky affirmed notice was posted in accordance with Wis. Stat. 60.12 (3) and 985.02 (2).

Minutes of the 2017 Annual Meeting were distributed. Motion by Phil Nies, seconded by Edmond Packee to approve the 2017 Annual Meeting minutes. Motion carried. Vote unanimous.

The 2017 financial statements prepared by CliftonLarsonAllen were distributed. Motion by Mark Laustrup, seconded by Dorothy "Doc" Brueggen to approve the 2017 financial statements. Motion carried. Vote unanimous.

Motion by Nies, seconded by Packee to hold the Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 16, 2019 at 6:30 pm. Motion carried. Vote unanimous.

Hall opened the floor to public comment.

Packee said that in looking at budget he has concerns about parks and education. Packee went on to say that there are ideas circulating that are not valid and some of those ideas come from the State. Packee asked a general question "How do we educate the Town to be more aware?" As an example, Packee stated that some people think northern are not native to Lake Lac Courte Oreilles when in fact they are.

Packee would like to know what property is owned by the Town. .

Packee reported that at the last annual meeting, a request was made for all draft minutes and only the Town Board draft minutes are posted. Clerk Warshawsky stated that the Town Board approved posting the draft minutes of Town Board meetings only. Hall stated that he would like to see draft Planning Committee minutes posted as well. Planning Committee member Phil Nies replied that the Planning Committee is not interested in posting draft minutes. Hall said that the topic will be discussed next month.

Packee asked where the southern boundary of the Town lies, stating that is important to know since it impacts taxes and representations on the County Board. Packee would like to see a map posted on the website. Hall stated that he will pass this on to Planning Committee to come up with a description.

Packee asked about who should be allowed to speak at Town meeting citing Sheri Shelton as an example. Shelton does not live in the Town, but spoke at the regular meeting as an animal control officer so that was permissible.

Motion by Packee, seconded by Nies to adjourn at 6:48 pm. Motion carried. Vote unanimous.
